Decorated Cakes Judging Time: Face-to-Face Thursday at 1:00 PM

Auction Time: Thursday at 6:00 PM

- Cake exhibits consist of a 5" square corner cut from one layer, should be flat
- Cakes will be judged on decorations only no tasting. Cake mixes may be used.
- Cakes must be frosted. It is recommended that no butter be used in frosting recipes.
- Cake boards should be no more than 2" larger than the cake with the base being at least ½" thick.
- All cakes are eligible to be entered in the Decorated Cake Auction.
- Forms on page 30 must be turned in when cake item is checked in.

Rules for Decorated Cake Auction:

- a. Cake and decorations must be prepared for human consumption no inedible ingredients.
- b. Size of the cake should be 9 x 13
- c. No raw egg whites in frosting (powdered is acceptable).
- d. Cake plate and plastic accessories become property of buyer.
- e. Only cakes can be auctioned
- f. A signed slip must be filled out by Thursday at 11:30AM in order to auction cake. Participation is optional.
- g. You are required to bring your cake in an appropriate box with cover that can be given to buyer.

- h. Youth are strongly encouraged to attend the auction and help sell their cake or arrange to have someone else stand in for them. If exhibitor is not present and has not arranged a standin, the cake will not be sold.
- i. Limit of one cake per exhibitor in the cake auction. CAKES NOT SOLD IN THE AUCTION WILL NOT BE RETURNED TO EXHIBITOR. However, ribbons may be picked up with the rest of exhibits.

- 7. All items should have a 3x5 card with an explanation of how item was made, materials used, pattern, process, intended use, history and any other information useful for judging.
