5. All items must be this past year's work
6. **Food Preservation**—all entries must have been canned after June 1st of last year. Each entry must have a Label stating date canned, name of product, method of preservation and time of processing. Ring must remain on jar. The judge may not open jars. Must be in a standard canning jar.
7. All items should have a 3x5 card with an explanation of how item was made, materials used, pattern, process, intended use, history and any other information useful for judging.
8. Best of Show Adult will be awarded at Noon on Saturday.
